ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Harriet Perry is the Director of the Center for Fisheries Research and Development at The University of Southern Mississippi's Gulf Coast Research Laboratory (GCRL). She began her career at the GCRL in 1968 working on a study of the distribution and abundance of zooplankton in coastal waters of Mississippi. Her research interests center on studies of brachyuran crabs with emphasis on the blue crab, Callinectes sapidus. She and her colleagues at Louisiana State University were instrumental in establishing design criteria and operational parameters for soft crab shedding systems in the Gulf of Mexico. She completed the first life history study of blue crabs in Mississippi waters and has been a major contributor to regional management plans for this species. Recent blue crab research has focused on the role of climate and ocean circulation processes in recruitment of blue crab larvae to estuaries in the Mississippi Bight. Her research on deepsea gervonid crabs defined limits of geographic and bathymetric distribution for the species *Chaceon guinguedens* and C. fenneri in the eastern and central Gulf of Mexico and provided estimates of harvest potential for C. quinquedens. With GCRL researcher, Dr. Ken Stuck, she established life history characteristics for a newly described species of stone crab in the western Gulf. Harriet serves on numerous regional and state committees including the Gulf States Marine Fisheries Commission, the Gulf of Mexico Fisheries Management Council, and the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources. She is a member of the Gulf of Mexico Regional Panel on aquatic invasive species and is chairman of the research workgroup. In 2003, she received the University's Excellence in Professional Service Award for her activities in support of marine fisheries.
