



Dr. D. Jay Grimes was Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs (2002-2007) and Director of the Gulf Coast Research Laboratory (1997-2007) at The University of Southern Mississippi where he is now a Professor of Coastal Sciences. Grimes is a fellow in the American Academy of Microbiology and in the American Association for the Advancement of Science; he is the past-chair of the American Society for Microbiology's Communications Committee and he is past-president of the U.S. Federation of Culture Collections. Grimes also served as vice chair of the Consortium for Oceanographic Research and Education, chair of the NASULGC Board on Oceans and Atmosphere, and served on the Science Advisory Panel to the U.S. Commission on Ocean Policy. He currently chairs the NOAA National Advisory Panel on Oceans and Human Health, is a Science

Advisor to the Joint Ocean Commission Initiative, and is the co-vice chair of the Gordon Research Conference on Oceans and Human Health. Most recently, Grimes has focused his research on the distribution of and human health risks from waterborne pathogens, especially *Vibrio* species. Grimes received his B.A. and M.A. in Biology from Drake University (1966 and 1968) and his Ph.D. in Microbiology from Colorado State University (1971).
